Our coalition includes: ACLU Ohio, Ohio Council of Churches, A. Philip Randolph Institute, Ohio Voter Rights Coalition, and more.








Ohio House & Ohio Senate Districts



33 Senators and 99 Representatives, per the Ohio Constitution.









What is Redistricting?


Redrawing district lines every ten years to reestablish population equality.






What is Reapportionment?

Each state gets a # of representatives determined by # persons in the state.



Ohio will change from 16 to 15 Congressional Districts

The worst excesses of map-making is called gerrymandering.

What's so bad about Gerrymandering?




Elbridge Gerry, MA Gov. MA Senate 1812

- Creates "safe" districts and predictable election outcomes
- Predictable outcomes create unresponsive elected officials
- The primary become the important contest and competitive primaries benefit extreme candidates
- Extreme candidates who cannot compromise lead to dysfunctional government
- Dysfunctional government serves no one

2012-2020 State House Results










Our current gerrymandered 4th District ...

Very different needs/interests across district Difficult for Representative to meet with all citizens Non-competitive district in General Election



Our District could be constructed to ...

Allow you to vote with fellow County residents
Include citizens with more similar needs
Easier for Representative to meet with District residents
Competitive District where more moderate candidates
have better chance of winning



Ohioans Want Fair Maps

- State legislative (2015) and Congressional (2018) redistricting reform passed overwhelmingly,
 >70% of the vote, passed in ALL 88 of Ohio's counties
- New Rules established for both State and Federal redistricting

New Rules for Drawing Congressional Districts


The rules rein in worst of gerrymandering through:

- limits on splits of counties
- transparency
- public participation
- bipartisan mapmaking

- Congressional redistricting emphasizes counties as political building blocks.
- Of Ohio's 88 counties:
 - at least 65 counties shall be contained entirely within a district,
 - up to 18 counties may be split not more than once,
 - up to 5 counties may be split not more than twice.

Ohio's legislators will use these rules to draw congressional maps with the bipartisan Redistricting Commission as back-up if they cannot reach a compromise

2020 U.S.CENSUS

POPULATION

How is the population changing and growing?

- In 2020, 331 million people lived in the United States.
- The population grew by 1.2 million from 2019 to 2020, with 41% of growth from immigration.
- According to preliminary data, the 2020 death rate was the highest since 1943.
- The population is getting older.
- More people are living alone.
- The absolute number of non-Hispanic white people has decreased every year since 2017.



2020 U.S.CENSUS

More specific data necessary for creating new districts is required by law to be sent to states by 1 April.

But Census Bureau says 2020 data won't be available

until late August.

Ohio U. will prepare data for map-making (Sept ?)





2020 U.S.CENSUS

Problems for Ohio

Ohio Constitution requires a state map by 1 September and a Congressional map by 30 September.

Possible solutions:

- Accelerate / compress process
- Change the Ohio Constitution
- Seek leniency from Ohio Supreme Court
- Alter primary election dates in 2022



Fair Districts' Response

- Mapmakers should not wait for the data to host public hearings or use this new timeline as an excuse to limit transparency, public participation, or bipartisanship.
- Do as much as we can now; adjust later
- Let Ohio mapmakers know that Ohioans still want Fair Maps, transparency, and public participation.
